Unfortunately due to various factors, the Parish Council has had to alter some of its meeting dates. The May 2018 meeting has also been moved from the 16th May to the 23rd May. Development Updates...

Solihull Local Plan

Solihull MBC continue to work on the Solihull Local Plan Review. Towards the end of 2017 the Council decided that the timetable for producing the Solihull Local Plan should be changed. One of the key reasons for this was the need to consider the findings of the Greater Birmingham Housing Market Area (HMA) Strategic Growth Study that was being undertaken.

The revised timetable is expected to proceed as follows:

- Publication of Submission Draft (for consultation)– Summer / Autumn 2018
- Submission to Secretary of State – Winter 2018/19
- Examination of Plan – Spring 2019
- Adoption of the Local Plan Review – Summer 2019

In line with the other 13 local authorities in the HMA area, the study was completed and published in February 2018.

It has been established that there is a considerable shortfall in planned provision to meet housing requirements in the HMA. All authorities within the HMA are expected to not only accommodate their own needs, but also take a share of the wider shortfall.

Work continues to consider options for dealing with the shortfalls.

Premises Licensing Act Application-PREM904/18

Tidbury Green Farm – The Parish Council objected to the application. We have learnt that this application has been withdrawn

Protect Your Property

Sadly yet again during the last few months Tidbury Green Parish Council have learnt of a number of break-ins to homes in the local area. A number of crimes involve thieves entering homes in order to obtain the keys to vehicles, which are then stolen.

Please remember to lock your windows and doors, including porches when leaving home. It is also important to activate any alarms even if you are only leaving your home for a short while

Where possible motion activated lighting and CCTV cameras should be set up at the front and rear of your property

Steering wheel locks are recommended to be used on your vehicles.

In the darker hours leave a light on even if you are at home, houses can often look unoccupied when we are in one room. Consider using light timers if you are returning home after dark.

Do not leave any valuables on display especially near windows where they can easily be seen. Ensure car keys are not within reach and cannot be 'fished' from the letterbox or window.

Other things you can do to help protect your home:

- Ensure that all shrubs and hedges do NOT exceed the maximum height of 1m and Tree canopies are lifted to 1.8m. This allows for maximum natural surveillance.
- Ensure that all fences are the same height as smaller fencing abutting higher fencing acts as a potential climbing aid for offenders. Consider attaching trellis to the top of fencing as this makes climbing over difficult.
- Ensure that all garden furniture is stored away in a garden shed along with any tools. Secure ladders.
- Ensure that Wheelie Bins are not stored near to fences or flat roofs to prevent them from being used as climbing aids.

Dog Fouling and Clearing Up After Your Pet

Once again we would like to remind you that if you take out a dog you must clean up its mess.

We have recently learnt of occasions where dog owners do pick up their dogs mess, however rather than taking the waste bags home and disposing of them, they place them in neighbours bins or on their trees/bushes. This is totally unacceptable. It is your responsibility to take the bag home and dispose of it in the correct manner, rather than leaving the mess for someone else.

It is an offence to allow a dog to foul in a public place, without clearing the mess up. Solihull environmental health officers make regular patrols and respond to complaints. For first time offenders fixed penalty notices of £75 (reduced to £50 if paid within 5 days) are given. Persistent offenders can be fined up to £1000 and have gone to jail in Solihull for such an offence.


